Contribution Will Help Restore Threatened Ecosystems, Safeguard the Local Economy and Protect Public Health

The donation will help Coastkeeper collect and test water samples; organize programs to educate and train the public; and post water quality information on the interactive watershed database wiki <a href="www.sdwatersheds.org">www.sdwatersheds.org</a>.

This knowledge—collected monthly with the help of 400 volunteers per year—can help prevent public exposure to dangerous toxins and bacteria; guide decisions that protect and restore threatened ecosystems; and safeguard the local economy by ensuring that waterways are safe for nearly 27 million beachgoers every year.

Through "1% for the Planet," Cali Bamboo provides one percent of its annual revenues towards environmental groups around the United States, thereby setting an example for the rest of the business community.

"Not only is it our mission to do our part as a company to protect the environment, but a lot of our staff enjoy spending time at the beach; so contributing to a program that aims to improve our local waters was important to us," said Jeff Goldberg, CEO of Cali Bamboo.
